Subject/class	EAL Session 3: Family members	Context	Session 3 for New to English students.
Connect the Learning An activity to help students understand how this lesson relates to previous learning.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are given a series of questions that are jumbled up. Students must un-jumble the questions. Extension – students could be given the answers to the questions and they have to provide the questions. 		
Big Picture Explain how this lesson fits into the particular topic/overview this particular lesson	<p>By the end of the lesson, students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand key vocabulary about family members Recognise key personal information in the third person Describe a member of their family using the third person 		
Starter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Put a series of digital times on the table and then ask students to place a greeting card next to the time: This will provide the context for the different greetings. 		
New information Present new information to students in a variety of stimulating and engaging ways to reflect different learning styles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are given pictures of <i>'The Simpsons'</i> family and they have to match the relationship title to the picture (card sort activity) Extension – students revisit the previous lesson's learning and try to give third person information about one Simpson family member Key Language – he/she is called he/she is/has/lives/comes from 		
Main activities (including mid-point reviews) The section of the lesson where a variety of student activities take place and where learning reviews happen	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students have been asked to bring a picture of their own family. Students choose one member to give a written description using a template as per the example below: <u>My bother</u> He is called He is years old He comes from He lives in 		
Demonstrate A vital part of the learning cycle where students demonstrate in some way what they have learned.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students then read out their description and other students in the class record the key information in a table provided. 		
Review	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are given a picture of one of <i>'The Simpsons'</i> family and have to stick it to their forehead. Members of the class then give them key information to work out who it is.
