At Horizon Community College we encourage all of our students to travel to and from College actively, be it through cycling or walking. The college has facilities for cycles to be stored safely throughout the college day, safe footpaths around the site, and we work in partnership with Barnsley Council and local organisations to support students in choosing Active Travel to get to college.

### In the Classroom

At Horizon Community College, we are proud to offer all students a broad and exciting curriculum. All students have the opportunity to experience a wide range of subjects, ensuring that from Year 7 to Year 11, they gather a range of skills and qualifications that will provide solid foundations for success in future study and whichever career they choose to follow.

In Year 7, all students study a core curriculum of English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Modern Foreign Languages, Religious Education, Citizenship and Physical Education, as well as a wider curriculum of Art, Performing Arts, Design and Technology and Computing.

As well as developing students' understanding of the subjects they study, our 'Character in the Classroom' initiative helps students develop as learners, promoting the behaviours that high performing students demonstrate across their lessons so that everyone can realise fully their potential through their journey through secondary school and beyond. This, as well as the extensive range of subjects we offer means that students have the opportunity to learn a fantastic variety of knowledge and skills that will help obtain a sense of the world around them, and begin to make decisions about what courses they might choose to study in Years 10 and 11.

# **Teaching & Learning**

We're really proud of our Teaching and Learning offer at Horizon. Students are taught by specialists across our wide subject range. Lessons take place in specialist facilities, including dedicated STEM rooms for Science and Design Technology, studios for Art and Photography, our state-of-the-art Performing Arts studios and Theatre, and our extensive PE spaces and ICT facilities. All classrooms are equipped with the latest audio-visual facilities, to support engaging and instructive teaching in every lesson.

Our Teaching and Learning strategy draws on best practice from a wide range of evidence and research bases, focusing on:

- High expectations and positive relationships
- Questioning and discussion
- Explanation and modelling
- Scaffolding and differentiation
- Deliberate practice and retrieval
- Responsive teaching and metacognition

These 6 elements have been shown to have the biggest impact on student progress in the classroom, and all staff have regular CPD to support their development in these areas, so that your child can be challenged in every lesson, every day.

### **Personal Development**

Personal development at Horizon Community College extends the curriculum beyond the expected academic, technical and vocational and provides our students with opportunities to develop passion, talent and interests. We believe in providing rich experiences of exceptional quality, in the curriculum and through a full range of extra-curricular activities, that considerably strengthen the character and education of our students. We support learners in developing their character including their resilience, confidence and independence, ensuring they know how to stay physically and mentally healthy throughout. At every stage of our students' journey, we provide an outstanding programme of careers and enterprise, preparing students for further education and next steps, ensuring students are work ready. In turn, students are prepared for life in modern Britain within all subject areas but additionally through an in-depth programme of citizenship and tutor period debate.

### **Remote Learning Offer**

To ensure that every student is challenged in every lesson, every day, at Horizon we have put together a nationally-recognised remote learning offer. Through our remote learning platform, 'Microsoft Teams', students can follow their normal timetable by logging in to live lessons taught by their class teacher, so that they don't miss out on learning, should they be absent for whatever reason.

Lesson materials are also uploaded to each students' Class Team, so that they can recap, catch up or extend their learning at home where necessary. Where students are digitally disadvantaged, we can support with device loans or technical advice, so that all students can take advantage of this offer should they need to.

### **Beyond the Classroom**

#### What extra-curricular opportunities do Year 7 students have?

Students at Horizon Community College have the chance to experience a wide range of extra-curricular activities to further enhance their studies beyond the classroom. Be it sport, fitness, music, STEM, dance or drama, students can take part in a choice of clubs and pursuits to suit their interests. As students progress through College, we also offer opportunities such as the Duke of Edinburgh Award, where participants learn and develop new skills, volunteer to support the wider community and take part in expeditions in the Peak District.



### **Careers & Enterprise**

The Careers landscape is changing faster than at any point in our history and will provide so many opportunities for young people. It is important, therefore, to give our students the skills and confidence to navigate this changing landscape successfully. At Horizon Community College we regard the preparation for life after GCSE's and those options as important as academic learning achievements. ### Attendance & Punctuality

#### Excellent attendance + effort = successful learning

We are committed to ensuring that all students are School ready; Work ready; Life ready. It is, therefore, pivotal that students have excellent attendance. We aim that all students should have attendance of 100% and will take steps to support families when attendance falls below this. Excellent and improving attendance will be rewarded every half term through our attendance assemblies.

Good punctuality is vital. Students are welcomed every morning at the student entrance by the Year 7 leadership team to ensure they are ready for the day ahead. Students can then make use of the college ICT facilities or head to the dining hall to enjoy breakfast (including the free magic breakfast) with their peers. The day commences at 9am with a 30 minute form period where students will engage in activities around attendance, literacy and numeracy. They will also be involved in the Votes For Schools weekly activity giving them the opportunity to discuss topical issues that address multiple curriculum areas such as citizenship, PSHE and British Values.
