Horizon Community College – September 2020



Overview

- ► Year 7 will have an induction day on Tuesday 1st September
- ► College will be open to all students, in all year groups, from Wednesday 2nd September
- Students will follow their normal timetable, as planned
- Students will follow a full curriculum, as planned
- ► Each year group will be set up as a 'bubble' and have the majority of their lessons in the same area of the college building



How we will operate

- ► Each year group will have its own 'bubble' or area of the college
- Enhanced cleaning and hygiene routines will be in place
- There will be split breaks and lunches, at different times and in different locations within college
- Classrooms have been re-designed
- Policies have been updated to reflect COVID guidance and a robust risk assessment put in place

How we will operate

- College expectations will remain the same:
 - Behaviour and standards
 - Attendance and punctuality
 - Uniform and equipment
 - Movement between classrooms
- Classrooms will be re-organised for first day back:
 - ► Tables in rows
 - New interactive whiteboards
 - Mini-whiteboards, pens and glue sticks in each classroom
 - New exercise books



Further details

- Split break and lunchtimes will reduce contact between students
- Additions have been made to the Behaviour Policy*
- Desks will be in rows in classrooms
- Cleaning of communal and specialist areas will be enhanced
- Year group toilets and hand sanitiser stations will be located within bubbles
- There will be frequent and regular communication with students and parents

Further details

- ▶ Entry and exit to the building will be staggered for each year group
- ▶ There will be a 'school within school' model until further notice
- Our updated curriculum will help students with 'missed learning'
- ► Timetabled lessons (including form period) have been re-roomed to enable bubbles
- Students will be expected to take exercise books home
- Face masks will not be required within college
- Visits to the college will only take place via pre-booked appointment




Learning in specialist areas

- Where students use specialist teaching rooms, enhanced cleaning is planned
- Students may not be able to use all specialist equipment eg some musical instruments
- ▶ PE lessons will still take place as normal, in the PE block. Students will still be expected to bring their PE kit for these lessons
 - Note for the first lesson, students will go to their timetabled classroom to be met by their PE teacher, who will escort them to the PE block

Classroom Set Up - example





Student Uniform

- ► There are no changes to uniform
 - Students may wear a black Kicker shoe
 - No trainers are allowed
- ▶ We will lend uniform and footwear to any students who need it
- ► There will be regular checks by School teams and form tutors
- Families are recommended to read the Uniform Requirements booklets (see college website)





Student Equipment

- As normal, students will be expected to bring a suitably sized bag to hold the following items:
 - Exercise books (enough for 5 lessons as they will be expected to take these home)
 - Knowledge file and planner
 - Reading book for Y7 and Y8
 - ▶ Black pen, purple pen, pencil, ruler, eraser, pencil sharpener and calculator
 - ▶ We recommend the Casio FX-85 calculator
 - ▶ PE kit on the day it is required





Praise and Rewards

- As a college, we believe that by celebrating and rewarding the efforts and achievements of our students we cultivate their self-belief, foster self-esteem and drive their ambition to be **positive role models**
 - Some examples of praise will include:
 - ▶ Recognising and rewarding students through Achievement Points using the Praise board
 - Awarding a 'Star of the lesson' (5 Achievement Points)
 - Awarding positive conduct points through the planner in both lesson time and unstructured hours
 - Nominating students work for 'Proud Thursday'
 - ▶ Using Praise postcards, stampers, stickers and other incentives

Consequences

- In the classroom, where students are not meeting expectations, the following system will be applied:
 - ► A positive rule reminder on entry to class or at the start of lesson
 - C1 a verbal warning
 - C2 a further warning and a behaviour point is given
 - C3 the student is moved (parked) to another classroom and a 30 minute C3 detention issued
 - C5 following a serious incident, a student may need to be taken to the Time-out Room and a 1 hour C5 detention issued

Working within a bubble - key points

- ► All bubble areas will have their own toilets and spaces for handwashing
- All year groups will follow their planned curriculum for 2020/21 the main difference will be that most lessons will be within their 'bubble' or area of the college
- Year 10 and 11 option subjects may use specialist spaces this is allowed within government guidance
- Year 11 will have access to specialist Science teaching spaces



Working within a bubble - key points

- ► For break and lunch, the Heartspace will be split into two areas, with barriers between each
- Students will be expected to bring their own water, as water fountains will not be in use
- ► The Canteen and Café will provide a limited menu of 'grab and go' food. It is recommended that students bring a healthy packed lunch where possible
- Lockers will **not** be in use, due to locations being outside bubbles

Entry and exit to site

- Entry:
 - Students will enter college as normal via the Student Entrance and be greeted by their School team
 - Students will head straight to their allocated school bubble, ready for the start of the day
- **Exit:**
 - > Y7, Y8, Y9, Y10 will leave via the Student Entrance (as normal)
 - ▶ Y11 will leave via the fire escape at the back of the Science Block
 - Staff will be on duty to support social distancing as students leave college grounds



Magic Breakfast

- We will continue to offer the free Magic Breakfast in the Canteen before the start of the college day
- Students will be able to go to the Canteen and select items from a limited menu
- ► The Canteen will be divided to into year group bubble areas
- Movement to and from the canteen through the Heartspace will be monitored by duty staff



Movement within bubbles

- ► Each year group or bubble will have their own set of stairs
- ► A one way system will not be needed within a bubble as all the year group will move together
- Students will enter the PE Block from outside:
 - ► Changing rooms 1 & 2 via the rear fire doors
 - ► Changing rooms 3, 4 & 5 via the side emergency doors
 - ▶ Changing rooms 6, 7 & 8 via the upstairs entrance



Buses

- Bus timetables are available on the college website through the Parents' Hub, and have been e-mailed to all families via ParentMail
- As stated in Government guidance, students will not be expected to wear a face covering or to social distance whilst travelling on these services
- ▶ Students may be asked to use hand sanitiser when getting on the bus
- Students will still be able to pay for fares with cash



Student Well-being

- A team of Student Well-being Officers will be located in 10.01
- ▶ This should be the first point of call for students. The team offers support for:
 - General student well-being
 - Uniform and equipment, including lost items
 - Any other concerns they may have
- A Well-being Student Hub is also available for students online, through the Horizon Student Hub. This contains links and resources for students to help them support their own wellbeing
- Student Well-being ambassadors, a fast-track referral system and Form Tutor programmes will also be in place in September to support student well-being

Tue 1st September - Y7 Induction Day

- ▶ There will be two sessions for students:
 - ▶ 1st session: 09:30 to 11:30
 - 2nd session: 12:30 to 14:30
- Plan for each session:
 - Students will sign in as they enter the college through Student Entrance
 - Students will be taken to their form rooms.
 - ► They will meet their form tutor and be welcomed into the college. As part of their welcome, they will be given details of their
 - ▶ Timetable
 - ► Uniform and equipment
 - ► Expectations and standards
 - Mrs Malson and Mrs Heskett will visit each form room and formally welcome students to Horizon



Wed 2nd September – First Day Back

- ▶ Students will go to their form rooms at the start of their school day:
 - ▶ They will be guided to their form room from the Student Entrance
 - Staff will also be present in their 'bubble' area to greet and support
- There will be an extended form period for all year groups until 10:30. During this time:
 - ▶ The Standards, Health & Safety and Character in the Classroom videos will be shown
 - Frequently Asked Questions will be answered and specific year group information provided
 - All planners, timetables and knowledge files will be distributed
- Normal timetables will start at 10:30
- ► Thursday 3rd and Friday 4th September will be normal school days
