## WHY FEMINISM IS STILL RELEVANT

'Feminism' is a word we see a lot in modern media and society as a whole. Everybody has their own definitions regarding it; however, it is generally seen as the fight for women's rights and freedoms and an opposition to misogyny. Despite feminism's still undoubtable impertinence today, how can we understand its necessity if we don't understand it ourselves?

### Where did feminism originate from?

The word feminism itself was first coined in 1837 by French philosopher, Charles Fourier as 'féminisme'. During this period of early advocacy for equality, the term 'feminism' referred to "feminine qualities or character," yet toward the end of the century it became inextricably linked to the suffragist movement. One of the first examples of feminism in literature is Mary Wollstonecraft's 1792 manifesto, 'A Vindication of the Rights of Woman'. Throughout the book, she argues that women should be allowed to have equal education to men and confronts the ideology of women being feeble-minded and unable to comprehend everything men can. Even today, she is considered the mother of feminism. Wollstonecraft's views particularly influenced American education campaigners such as Margaret Fuller and Elizabeth Cady Stanton. Famous writer, Virginia Woolf (who wrote feminist essay, "A Room of One's Own") said of her, "we hear her voice and trace her influence even now among the living."

### What is intersectional feminism?

A term defined as 'the complex, cumulative way in which the effects of multiple forms of discrimination (such as racism, sexism, and classism) combine, overlap, or intersect especially in the experiences of marginalized individuals or groups.'

Intersectional feminism acknowledges the many ways that each woman experiences discrimination; 'white feminism' is a term

used to describe a type of feminist who neglects the difficulties women of color, LGBTQ women and women of other minority groups face. This type of feminist is prevalent in history; for example, Susan Anthony prioritised wealthy, white women's rights over rights for every woman of every background. Tammy L. Brown authored an article for the ACLU, in which she stated, "When suffragists gathered in Seneca Falls, New York, in July 1848, they advocated for the right of white women to vote. The participants were middle and upper-class white women, a cadre of white men supporters and one African American male — Frederick Douglass. The esteemed abolitionist had forged a strong working relationship with fellow abolitionists and white women suffragists, including Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony. No Black women attended the convention. None were invited."

This piece of writing is a clear indicator on how the face of the women's rights movement were privileged, upper-class white women. Rights in general is great, however what is not great is the exclusion of women of colour for the benefit of white people.

## How is feminism portrayed in the media?

Feminism in the media can range anywhere from out-right diminishing, sexist headlines to sassy Beyonce quotes on your Instagram feed, but there is no denying it's place on social media. Cases of misogyny are so

frequent in the media, that we may simply brush over their existence. Examples include:



The tweet above is speaking about Corey Cogdell, an American athlete who just so happens to be married to an American football player. Opposed to focusing on her achievements (it was her second Olympic bronze medal), they only see her for her husband and his efforts, completely dismissing her own impressive accomplishments.



The New York Post article is regarding Former Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton. When the picture was taken, she was defending herself in a high-profile Congressional meeting and therefore must be a humourless tyrant at home. The fact that she wasn't smiling throughout an important meeting doesn't indicate her personality, but the headlines written about it indicate a strong sense of misogyny. The proof is in the pudding; women's emotions are judged and penalised more so just because of their gender.

This ideology of women being blinded by their emotions perpetuates the mindset of women being inferior and subservient to men; naturally, this mentality has a biblical background. The idea of women being fainthearted, and incompetent relates back to The Garden of Eden, where Eve is tempted by the serpent to eat the forbidden fruit. Her so-called 'naivety' led to God cursing the serpent, the woman, then the man, before expelling the man and woman from the Garden before they ate of the tree of eternal life.

## How can we ensure feminism is at the forefront of our minds going forward?

As I have previously mentioned, I find that feminism impacts everyday life. The conversations we have with one and other, the music being produced, the videos we watch; most of these things regard women, whether you are the woman in the conversation or whether the topic revolves around women. For example, only around a year or so ago, massmisogynist Andrew Tate was on everybody's TikTok feed, ranting continuously about his definition of women, and promoting sexism to his susceptible, teenage boy audience. Ironically, as I write this, a pair of young boys have just walked past, spurting bigoted remarks about women that's gained them a light scold and disapproving look. I think that is reason enough to justify feminism's purpose in society and the fact that in 2024, I am writing an article, arguing it's place is also reason enough.

#### **Leeds vs Preston North End**

They were given a penalty and up steps Joel Peroe. He got ready to shoot and he scored! It was a miracle for Leeds in the 90+4 minute he won a triumphant victory for the team.

### **Bayern Munich vs Werder Breman**

In the first half of the game, the score was 0-0. As the chances came thick and fast after the break, Van Dijk thought he had headed Liverpool in front on the hour only for the goal to be contentiously ruled out for offside against Wataru Endo following a lengthy Video Assistant Referee (VAR) intervention as the Japan midfielder blocked off Chelsea defender Levi Colwill.

Conor Gallagher was also denied by the woodwork, then once more by the defiant Kelleher as he looked poised to make the breakthrough, Liverpool's keeper darting off his line to save while Chelsea somehow failed to score in a desperate goalmouth scramble in the closing moments of normal time.

Kelleher's Chelsea counterpart Djordje Petrovic was called into action in extra time, turning over a header from Liverpool's teenage substitute Jayden Danns while Harvey Elliott shot into the side-netting from a good position, also seeing a header miraculously kept out by the keeper. And then came that final twist to give Liverpool another Wembley victory over Chelsea and leave Pochettino still seeking his first trophy in England.



### **Barnsley VS Derby County**

Derby Country was granted the resulting corner which saw Eiran Cashin's header clear off the line and then Hourihane's 18th-minute corner was met by Bradley, whose header found the net. Conor Hourihane, was the first to threaten his opposition when he capitalized on a defensive error from Donovan Pines and fired in a shot which was deflected wide. Barnsley equalized fifteen minutes later when an attempted clearance fell to Phillips, who chested the ball down and hammered a volley just inside Joe Wildsmith's right-hand post from the edge of the area.

Barnsley's Nicky Cadden had a shot comfortably saved soon after the restart, but Phillips was

### Manchester City vs Manchester United

It seems a long time ago now that Pep Guardiola was having to defend his treatment of a player, he was accused of holding back raw talent when exciting youth academy player, Jadon Sancho, was excelling at Borussia Dortmund after realising he would not wait around to develop at City.

Phil Foden's equalizer was City's 600th goal in this stadium under Guardiola and it was a sublime effort. It was curled into the top corner out of Onana's reach, after he had run across Victor Lindelof on the right edge of the United box. His second saw him burst into the area from the other side, collect a pass from Julian Alvarez and drill a low shot home, almost through the United keeper, who could have done better to save the shot.

Foden is now picking his moments to get involved in attacks and watching England boss, Gareth Southgate, must surely find a way of getting the 23-year-old, who has scored 18 goals this season, into his starting line-up at Euro 2024 alongside the likes of Harry Kane and Jude Bellingham.

Haaland will have been pleased to get his name on the scoresheet given his incredible first half miss when he somehow put Foden's knockback over an open goal from three yards.

### **Leeds United VS Sheffield Wednesday**

Patrick Bamford put the audience on the verge of ecstasy near half-time, as he tapped in the ball at the far post from Junior Firpo's fine left-wing delivery.

The Owls defense was caught out again for Leeds' second goal, as Wilfried Gnonto fired in following a swift Leeds attacking move.

It was a difficult night for penultimate victors, Wednesday, who offered little in response after Bamford's opener, as they could not continue their fine recent form to move out of the relegation battle. Victory for Leeds means they leapfrog Ipswich Town into second place, going a point above the Tractor Boys - who faced Cardiff on Saturday - and two behind the leaders, Leicester Football Club.

For the hosts, however, their winning run ended abruptly, and they remain in 23rd position, leveling on points with Stoke and Huddersfield in a crowded battle for Championship survival. Wednesday almost took the lead in the 16th minute when Marvin Johnson's corner fell to Djeidi Gassama, whose close-range finish was kept out by a stunning block from Leeds keeper, Illan Meslier.

Georginio Rutter twice came close for the visitors, first when he tried to chip a ball over Wednesday's keeper, James Beadle, and then glanced an effort on to the top of the net. Four minutes of time were added to the first half after a break in play, when Joe Rodon and Firpo collided, but the additional time benefited Leeds. Bamford prospered with his seventh goal in 10 league games in 2024 as Owl's defender, Akin Famewo, failed to pick him up when Firpo delivered an optimum ball into the box. Leeds doubled their advantage in the 58th minute after Meslier launched a free kick up field, with Rutter eventually sending Gnonto through to finish with ease.

Daniel Farke's side should have further added to their lead from the restart as Crysencio Summerville went clear and forced a solid save from Beadle. But they held on for a resolute victory against their Yorkshire rivals - their 11th in 12th league games.

# UNDERSTANDING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN UNLEADED AND DIESEL PETROLEUM:

**UNLEADED:** The older and cheaper brother of diesel.

**DIESEL:** A more durable but more expensive option.

It is important to know what type of fuel your vehicle consumes. Failure to put the correct fuel in results in a full engine rebuild, which can cost thousands of pounds!

#### Car hacks:

- 1) Use hand sanitizer to de-ice frozen car locks.
- 2) Use cupcake liners to keep cupholders clean.
