Thank you to everyone who participated and helped make this day so meaningful. Lest we forget.


Careers Fair

Iceland

Iceland Adventure: Students Experience Fire, Ice, and the Northern Lights

During the October half-term, a group of Y10 students jetted off to Iceland for a once-in-a-lifetime geographical and cultural adventure. After a smooth flight from Manchester, they arrived in Reykjavík and settled into Hotel Cabin, ready for three unforgettable days.

Golden Circle Wonders Day one began with the famous Golden Circle Tour, visiting Kerid Crater, Gullfoss Waterfall, the Geysir geothermal area, and Thingvellir National Park. Students were amazed by Iceland's natural beauty, especially the power of Gullfoss. The day ended with a relaxing dip in the Secret Lagoon, dinner at the Hamburger Factory, and even a glimpse of the Northern Lights on the walk home.

South Shore Adventure The next day's South Shore Tour included Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls, the retreating Sólheimajökull Glacier, and Vík's Black Sand Beach. At the Lava Centre, students explored Iceland's volcanic history before heading to Hotel Örk. Although the Northern Lights didn't appear, swimming in the outdoor pool as snow fell made for a magical evening.

Reykjanes Peninsula Wonders The final day began with pastries from a local bakery before exploring the Reykjanes Peninsula. Highlights included the Bridge Between Continents, bubbling geothermal pools, and an earthquake simulator at the Earthquake Exhibition. Students also saw recent lava fields and took home cooled lava souvenirs. The trip ended perfectly with a visit to the Blue Lagoon before heading home the next day - tired, happy, and full of memories to last a lifetime.



Everybody Dance ~ York

Students in the Y10 BTEC class and our Y9 Dance Option groups were selected to perform at York Theatre Royal as part of the "Everybody Dance" festival.

Students had to choreograph a response to the stimulus home- our Y10 BTEC group performed a piece based on a Japanese animation and our Y9 dancers chose to explore immigration as a starting point. During the day students got to take in the breathtaking beauty of the theatre and had the opportunity to do several workshops, a professional tech

rehearsal on the stage and a performance to a sold-out audience.

Dance ~ Leeds (Y10 BTEC)


Students in the Y10 BTEC class were selected to be part of the INSPIRE programme with the Northern School of Contemporary Dance. NSCD is a leading conservatoire for Contemporary Dance and offers a range of degrees and pathways into the world of professional dance.

Students worked hard in late night intensive rehearsals leading up to the performance where they worked with Alumni NSCD students to create a piece of dance.

On the day students travelled to NSCD in Leeds and were able to look around all of the spaces including wonderful dance studios, teaching spaces and the Riley Theatre. The building is a converted synagogue so incredibly unique and interesting.

Students got the opportunity to learn repertoire from a COLLIDE dance piece created and toured by NSCD in a morning workshop. They also experienced a full professional tech run on stage and enjoyed a sharing afternoon which included a careers talk about courses that NSCD offer, a sharing of work where our students performed their work, and two incredible performances from COLLIDE dance which left us all totally inspired.

Students were then able to celebrate their successes enjoying some shopping in the Trinity Centre and a meal in the Trinity Kitchen.
